WELCOME BACK TO SAINT MICHAEL'S CHURCH

On Saturday 4th July, St Michael's Church in Tadley re-opened for Private Prayer from 10.00 am—4.00 pm. All being well, it will be open again on Saturday 11th July from 10.00 am—4.00 pm for more Private Prayer. The opening time may be curtailed if we do not have enough Stewards, but full information will be available from The Parish Office and on the notice in the glass board alongside the church door by Friday 10th July.

A sincere thanks to all who made this possible and who have volunteered to clean the church and to steward. We shall need more volunteers when the two churches re-open on 1st/2nd August for Masses, especially from St Oswald's Church. The provision of Masses will require a regular commitment from volunteers, probably well into 2021AD. More details on Sunday and weekday Masses in future Newsletters.

A special thanks to our part-time Secretary, Barbara, for working throughout the week to ensure that all necessary hygiene measures were in place, and especially for her work with Father Patrick all day Friday 3rd July. Also to Hugh Lobo for his assistance with signage, and to Geoff and Gina Poulter for organising the Rota for Stewards.

The week leading to the re-opening was especially stressful, with the new e-mail system introduced by the Diocese constantly failing and losing e-mails. This was particularly frustrating as there were several conflicting updates emanating from the Diocesan Office until late Friday 3rd July, following the publication of the Government Guidelines at the beginning of that week for the re-opening of religious buildings for Public Worship from 11th July. It was extremely difficult to deal properly with Parish matters, including requests for Marriage and Baptism Preparations. Father Patrick apologises if he is unable to deal with some matters until we are reopened for Masses and asks that you respect the immense pressure Barbara has been under. She is contracted to do 15 hours a week—last week it was 37 + hours! This area will have to be addressed in August.

Both Father Patrick and Barbara greatly appreciate the gift of a bottle of wine each from Tina van Ewyk, on behalf of the volunteer cleaners (Tina and Rob Van Ewyk and Anna Lobo), following the sanitising of the church on Friday, for which all was prepared, saving them considerable time. A special thank you to them for their time and help in getting the church sanitised and ready for reopening.

The Parish is also grateful to Pam Darroch, who generously tidied up some of the church areas and assisted Barbara at the beginning of the week to cover the pews with plastic for the period of Private Prayer. This will end once Masses resume and the pews are returned to their proper places to enable more seating for parishioners.

On Wednesday evening, 1st July, Deacon Tony Darroch began The Risk Assessment for the re-opening of St Oswald's Church, assisted by Fr Patrick, Andy and Sarah Hunneman and Rick Wallis. Barry Rockhill, who addresses many items there, was unable to attend. Andy and Sarah have been asked to liaise with Ellen Goodall in respect of a Rota of Cleaners and Stewards for St Oswald's Church in the coming months.

The re-opening of St Michael's was a moment of Grace following its closure from 19th March. Including the Stewards (Deacon Tony and Pam, Christine Caren and Jo Mellor, Denis and Kath Murtagh), 21 people used the opportunity for Private Prayer. It was good that Ita McDonagh and members of her family were able to pray there on the anniversary of Ted's death. A great day and thanks to all who made it possible! However, this is only the beginning of the return to the new normal.

GARDENING THANKS!

The re-opening of St Michael's church coincided with the resumption of Gardening in the church grounds. It was good to meet, at a distance, with people coming to pray and with Brenda's gardening team, some of whom took advantage of the time to pray also. RETROUVAILLE—MARRIAGE DEVELOPMENT

Pam Darroch shares these thoughts from Clive & Kathy Jones, Coordinators of Retrouvaille England and Wales of how the current crisis may be an opportunity to grow and develop your marriage...

"It is the LORD who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not leave you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed." Deuteronomy 31:8

The consequences of what we have all lived through these past months, has been for many, a roller coaster. Lows are predominant now as many marriages are struggling, frayed by the relentless cycle of managing work, schooling children, toddlers, more cooking, in addition to increased housework. Add exhaustion, money worries and lack of usual support from family and it can feel overwhelming. Arguments and tensions increase, who does what, when and how becomes the focus. Finger pointing and blame creep in, flare-ups become more frequent, with no outlet for distress. If we came into lockdown already at odds with each other, it's probably got worse as the weeks passed. Hopelessness and thoughts of 'this marriage is not working' become more frequent.

What might help?

Prayer:

Yes prayer! Ask God who is already in your marriage for help. Consider taking a minute each morning to turn to each other, (hold hands if you can) and say 'Lord help us through this day. Amen'.

Arguments:

Money, time, mess, sex, kids are some topics argued about. Important to know that conflict is an inevitable part of living as a couple. Marriages that were faltering may be cracking under the strain. Increased arguments point to the need to have a better way of communicating and managing conflict, not to failure or the end.

Calm down:

Did you know we become deaf to each other when arguments escalate? Survival responses kick in (fight, flight, freeze). When both are calm, plan how you will give each other 'time out' when needed so listening can recommence. Some ideas: remove yourself to a quiet space,

bathroom? Count from 20-0 backwards; Listen to classical music; Pray; Breathe (internet); Physical exercise. Calming yourself is being responsible and loving.

Consider:

Learning some additional skills for managing conflict and improving communication. The Catholic Marriage Alliance website is a great starting point. Be kind and gentle to each other, you are good people doing your very best in a tough time.

Our Diocesan Marriage and Family Life (MFL) Office endorses and promotes the 'Retrouvaille' weekend. Married Couples may also wish to consider our 'Breakthrough' workshop. 'Breakthrough' offers couples an opportunity to overcome 'gridlock' in communication. They say 'it takes two to tango but it only takes One to change the dance'. <u>HAMPSHIRE ALERT—COVID—19 TRACK & TRACE</u> <u>SCAM</u>

A Silchester Parishioner has kindly passed on the following warning regarding their son who received a call from the 'Track and Trace Service' and was told that according to their system he had been in close proximity to someone who has tested positive for Covid 19. This meant he had to isolate for 7 days and take a Covid 19 test. The caller was unable to tell him any details as it was confidential information. The caller kept emphasising the test needed to be taken within 72 hours and that the caller needed his mailing address for the kit. He then went on to say he needed the bank card number for the kit which cost £50, and even threatened the son with non-compliance action. The son then realised that it was a SCAM as the TEST KIT IS FREE. Please be warned and pass this on to your family, your friends and neighbours.

Please also be aware that there have been a number of other scams operating over the last few weeks: Banks and Card Misuse

Purported calls from banks alleging fraudulent use of cards and accounts. Advise disconnect call and contact bank yourself to advise receipt of call and check validity.

HMRC

Telephone calls and emails purporting to be from HMRC, alleging a repayment and requiring your details. Again contact HMRC direct yourself.

TVLA

Emails being sent alleging a problem with your Direct Debit payment for TV Licence. Check with your bank.

They are very professional sounding and looking communications—please take care, if in doubt, disconnect and make your own investigations. Do not give out or confirm any of your personal details.
