In LET US DREAM (THE PATH TO A BETTER FUTURE), Pope Francis states: 'We cannot return to the false securities of the political and economic systems we had before the crisis It is an illusion to think that we can go back to where we were.: But he is very wary about providing pleasing blueprints for the future; wary about those who presume they are the only ones who have the solutions, religious or otherwise.

As the lockdown eases, The Leonard Rooms at St Oswald's Church will be able to open in a limited way for permitted groups of essential users and for the May Elections, complying with 2 metre distancing, sanitisation requirements and risk assessments. The 2 metre rule allows only a maximum of 15 persons to be present and church meetings are not yet allowed.

A special thanks to Hugh Lobo of our Tadley community, who like others from Kingsclere and Tadley enjoys attending the 10.30 am Sunday Mass at St Öswald's church, for the support he has given Barbara, by installing all the new sanitisers and dispensers. Recently they were working from 10.00 am to 6.00 pm on a Friday to expedite matters, and he provided considerable help when our churches were allowed to open last July.

Our part-time Secretary, Barbara, has once again been working beyond her regular hours to ensure that the building complies with Church and Government Guidelines. This has involved the establishment of moveable sanitisers, compliant toilet facilities and various other requirements. Also linking with the authorised groups and the electoral authorities and our Diocesan Health and Safety Officer. The income generated will be of considerable help to our Parish Finances.
