CATHOLIC MARRIAGE CARE

Dear Father Patrick,

A Happy New Year to you! Thank you for your support of our work at Catholic Marriage Care over the past years. Despite these challenging times, Marriage Care's support for marriage through relationship counselling and marriage preparation continues. We have moved all our face-to-face services to online alternatives using effective webcam technology, ensuring that we are able to continue to support as many people as possible.

COVID-19 has put increasing pressure on relationships and we urge couples to seek the support or expert help they need before they reach breaking point. Marriage Care offers a donation-only counselling service so that anyone can access support whatever their financial circumstances.

Marriage Preparation has also moved online and we continue to offer both Preparing Together and FOCCUS. Our Preparing Together day has been adapted to be delivered in three sessions of 90 minutes a week apart over Zoom allowing more time for the couples to complete the activities and to reflect on the commitment that they are going to make. One couple commented: "The three sessions were fun and thought-provoking and getting to meet other couples in the same position as ourselves made it a wonderful

experience. We feel much better prepared for our wedding as well as our married life together." We also offer FOCCUS marriage preparation online. This consists of individual couples completing an online inventory covering all aspects of married life including finances, communication, problem solving, sexual issues, extended family issues and also religion, covenant and commitment. A report is then generated and the couple discuss the findings with a trained facilitator in two sessions over Zoom. One couple recently commented after doing FOCCUS: "It was really nice working with you and to get the conversation started as to those difficult subjects we tend to shy away from. Thank you for listening and encouraging the conversation."
