# LOOKING TO MOVE FORWARD POSITIVELY AS A PARISH

#### (1) MICHAELMAS CELEBRATION

We celebrate the Mass of St Michael, Gabriel and Raphael as a <u>Solemnity</u> in the Parish on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> September at 7.30 pm in St Michael's Church. Booking will be as normal for this Mass, as for all forthcoming weekday Masses, from Tuesday of the previous week (22<sup>nd</sup> September) until 12.30 pm on the Thursday of the week (24<sup>th</sup> September). <u>Earlier bookings will not be accepted</u>.

## (2) 'THANK YOU' TINA!

To enable this Mass to be celebrated to comply with the guide-lines, a thorough clean of the church is necessary, and this will take place on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> September at 10.00 am onwards. Father Patrick expresses his thanks to Tina van Ewyk for agreeing to organise this clean, and she will be contacting volunteers to assist her. Tina has also generously agreed to organise cleans for Funeral and Memorial Masses in St Michael's Church when necessary. Father Patrick is in contact with the Spano Family in respect of a Memorial Mass for Margaret, whose Graveside Funeral took place on 21<sup>st</sup> April during lockdown. Should this Mass have to be celebrated on a Saturday evening, preference for attendance will be given to family with parishioners being asked to transfer to St Oswald's Church on the Sunday.

Tina would appreciate more volunteers, to enable celebrations more frequently in St Michael's Church in compliance with the guidelines of thorough cleaning. <u>Parishioners at Burghfield Common are asked to contact the Parish Office volunteering for cleaning groups to be organised at St Oswald's Church</u>. There is a Memorial Mass to be organised there as well, as well as a Baptism.

## (3) KEEPING THE GUIDELINES!

This is a requirement of both Church and the Government, and places of Worship can be closed if it is found they fail to comply. Bishop Philip and our Catholic Bishops have made it clear that churches should open with full compliance. This is especially important as we enter a period of the year when medical experts are expressing serious concern that a 'surge' is quite possible, possibly leading to a second, disastrous, lockdown nationwide. Our police are also worried that social distancing and other measures are being ignored, especially by some young people.

A) <u>SOCIAL DISTANCING</u> of 2 metres should be kept in our

churches - with only 1 metre acceptable if mitigating factors are in force.

- B) <u>SANITISERS</u> are to be used by all on entry and exit, with 2 metre distance observed by all.
- C) <u>FACEMASKS</u> are obligatory in all places of worship in England from 8<sup>th</sup> August, <u>unless</u> a medical exemption applies. Please speak to Fr Patrick if necessary, so that he is aware of an exemption. En try to a place of worship is refused if the rule is not followed. We are entering a difficult period and in charity are obliged to think of the health of others, as Christ would expect and Pope Francis makes clear.

<u>RESERVE STEWARDS</u> are asked to confirm that they will be attending a particular Mass so that a seat may be reserved for them.

### 4) WELL ORGANISED

Parishioners at the 6.00 pm Tadley Mass on 22<sup>nd</sup> August will recall the visit of PCSO Bethany, new to our area of Tadley and Baughurst. Whilst passing the church, she noticed a large gathering and asked Father Patrick the nature of this. She was delighted to learn that the church had re-opened and accepted the invitation to say a few words before Mass. Her comment as she watched people arrive was that it all seemed well organised and she should like to visit the other church, but could not do so as Burghfield Common was outside her area. Her few words of introduction received applause from the congregation, and looking down the church it was obvious that Barbara's work of bench numbering and distancing signs clearly demonstrated good organisation inside. Many thanks to Stewards and parishioners! And to Bethany!

## 5) PARISH RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIA-TION (RCIA) RESUMES IN BASINGSTOKE

Father Patrick is grateful to Deacon Tony Darroch for enabling Malcolm, Hazel and Maureen to resume their preparation to enter into Full Communion with the Catholic Church via the social distancing RCIA Preparation at St Bede's Church Hall starting later in September. Father Patrick had been juggling with resuming the Preparation in Tadley, using the socially distancing adapted Parish Room, or the larger Hall in Burghfield Common. This has yet to be adapted for larger social distanced Parish Meetings, and also Barbara is addressing the use of it for groups which ceased to meet during lockdown. However all this involves Risk Assessments and thorough cleaning. The Parish normally receives a useful income each year from lettings, and it is unlikely that this money will come to the Parish for 2020. It is good that our cleaner has now been taken off furlough by the Diocese at Father Patrick's request, but volunteer cleaners will be required to assist in maintaining St Oswald's Church and the Leonard Rooms.

Deacon Tony suggested that the Tadley Preparation could be linked to the St Bede's one if those involved were happy to travel there regularly. The actual Receptions would, God willing, take place in Easter 2021 in that which will probably be the still re-organized St Michael's Church. The three candidates have agreed to this, and Fr Patrick is also grateful to Joy Reilly for assisting in their continuing formation in our Cell Groups.

## (12) FORMATION FOR MISSION

In the last Newsletter (23<sup>rd</sup> August - 5<sup>th</sup> September 2020), Father Patrick encouraged those parishioners who have been engaged in Children's Liturgy in our churches to become involved with Sister Hyacinthe's Course for them and others involved in catechesis. It is important that as part of our moving forward in Mission that we ensure that people are properly prepared to engage with young people and their families during the pandemic and after it is under reasonable control. Now is the time to be doing this.

Our Formation for Mission is now offering diocesan Readers Workshops online. We had started offering them in parishes for the God who Speaks campaign, and had to cancel them due to Lockdown.

## (13) CORONAVIRUS ETHICS - AN INTER-ESTING FUTURE?

BBC Radio 4 gave considerable space in its 7.10 am religious programme last Sunday (31st August) to a debate in Australia about a possible vaccine from Oxford many hope will protect people from COVID 19. The leaders of the Anglican, Catholic and Orthodox Churches in Sydney have asked that political leaders seek a similar vaccine from another source, giving a choice not only to Christians, but to others from different religious beliefs or of none, alongside the Oxford vaccine being researched. The reason: the Oxford vaccine being proposed is linked to the use of past cell lines from an aborted foetus. The former Oxford scholar and scientist Archbishop Fisher, Catholic Archbishop of Sydney, outlined the position of the Christian leaders in his accustomed clear style. He is one of the finest Catholic commentators of our age.

Whilst he had no particular concern about the use of the vaccine from a moral point of view, there were others who did and were not prepared to receive it if it was the only one available. He and his colleagues felt that this genuine moral concern needed to be addressed both to control the pandemic as far as possible and to `respect conscientious objection. The Clergy were also expressing their alarm at serious suggestions being aired in political circles that those who refused the vaccine should be deprived of medical and social security rights. There is a growing debate in some countries about making any vaccine obligatory by law. Some are concerned about possible 'cutting of corners' to develop one quickly and possible side effects.

Archbishop Fisher explained his own moral position of acceptance of the Oxford vaccine, if proven safe, from an area of 20<sup>th</sup> Century History which Fr Patrick knows

well. During the Second World War, concentration camp inmates were used in barbaric and degrading experiments to save the lives of German pilots rescued from freezing seas. Some of the knowledge gained was actually of real medical use, which the Allies felt should be used for the good of mankind, although from an evil source The same applied to X-Ray experiments conducted in the camps, which proved valuable medically. In early August the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales also addressed the acceptance of the use of cells of aborted foetuses being used in vaccines. They rejected direct abortion, but expressed the importance of Catholic moral teaching in this matter.
